Program Description

Participants of the Strasbourg, France program will arrive in Paris and spend the first 4 days enjoying one of Europe's most beautiful and culturally rich cities. On day five participants will depart for Strasbourg, one of the European Union's most important cities, where they will live and take classes at the Château de Pourtalès for the remainder of the program.

Political Science: It is an exciting time to be studying international systems and major global issues, and what better place to study the heart of the major issues affecting the world to day than in one of the most important "capitals of Europe".

Business: Students are particularly interested in international business today, and this program gives students a unique perspective and opportunity not offered on campus.

English: By studying in France, students will be able to make pedagogical connections between European sources of English literary works, and will learn the methods of literary evaluation used both in America and in France.

Classes will typically take place for 2 hours every morning per course offering, Monday through Friday, with periodic afternoon sessions, and course related activities and excursions. The program is open to students from The Georgia Perimeter College and any accredited public or private university.
