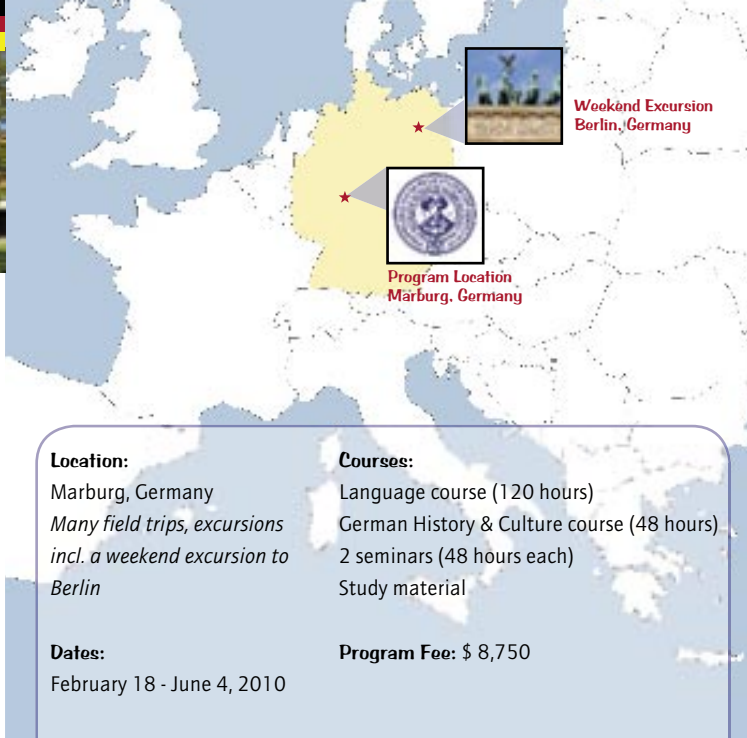

University of Marburg International University Marburg, Germany

February 18 - June 4, 2010

Located in the heart of Germany, Marburg an der Lahn is a small, lively and safe medieval town with a long university tradition. The location, university cafeteria and the romantic and picturesque old city with its castle, cafés, pubs, boutiques, as well as movie theatres, museums and theatres are all within walking distance. You will find your way around quickly. The program takes place at the University of Marburg, which was founded in 1527. With about 19,300 students and 7,500 staff members, it is one of Germany's medium-sized universities.

Immediately upon your arrival in Marburg the CEPA team and faculty members will begin to take care of your personal and academic needs which they will continue to do throughout the program. Weekend trips, evening events and special lectures provide a diverse program and complement your classroom studies. The activities and events also allow you to get to know each other better. You will learn a lot and feel at home.

Philipps-Universität Marburg is accredited by the German Ministry of Education.

Housing and Meals

You will have a room in one of the university dormitories which are situated outside the center and can easily be reached by local bus. A meal subsidy of EUR 50 per month is included in the program fee. This sum will be charged on to a debit card which can be used in the "Mensa" and cafeterias.



German Language Course

- Language lessons take place in the mornings
- Total of 8 semester credit hours (120 contact hours)

All levels are structured so that there are various units which take into account the various levels of previous knowledge of German among the students. The aim is to achieve a recognizable and measurable learning process with each student over the semester.

Courses and Seminars

- Lectures take place in the mornings and afternoons
- German history and culture course = 3 semester credit hours (48 contact hours)
- Seminars: = 3 semester credit hours for each seminar (one seminar equals 16 contact hours lecture plus 32 contact hours tutorial) Related to topics such as Political Science and Economics and Cultural Studies. Courses taught in either English or German.

Credits

Upon successful completion of the courses you can earn up to 17 US credits from the Philipps-Universität Marburg. Transcripts will be issued in ECTS credits and attendance counts toward credit.



Cultural Program:

In addition to the study program, an interesting cultural program is offered, which is covered by the fee.

An interesting cultural program with excursions to important historical and cultural sites is included, such as - Frankfurt, Berlin, Weimar or Eisenach, Cologne, Heidelberg, Munich etc. Our tutor for this cultural program has an open ear for students' suggestions and ideas, too.

The excursions will take place primarily on weekends.

This additional program provides you with the opportunity to learn more about Germany and Europe beyond the classroom.

- Day trips to Frankfurt, Cologne, Weimar, Trier for example
- Weekend excursion to Berlin (transportation, housing, for example: tour of the German Parliament and other cultural activities)



The University

Philipps-Universität Marburg is the oldest Protestant University in the world. Founded during the reformation in 1527, the University was founded on Christian ideals. Today, the University is home to about 20,000 students and offers a wide range of courses including law, education, theology, medicine and more. Marburg is very inviting to foreign students, who make up about 12 percent of the 20,000 students in Marburg.

Marburg has been the home to many famous researchers and academics including chemist Robert Bunsen, the inventor of the Bunsen Burner, T.S. Eliot, who spent a summer studying in Marburg in 1914, and The Brothers Grimm, known for their fairy tales.



Similar to many European Universities, Philipps-Universität has no central campus, rather the University buildings and dormitories are spread throughout the city. But don't worry, there is a 30 minute break which allows enough time for students to arrive at class on time.
