Information about the Program

The countries of the EU, especially France, lead the advanced industrial world in deploying alternative energies and minimizing global warming emissions. Moreover, these countries have been at the forefront of international efforts to fashion a global response to climate change (e.g., the Kyoto Protocol). This course studies the EU, and especially the French, efforts to ecologically modernize their advanced economies particularly in regards to global warming emissions and energy usage. The class also examines EU countries' strategies to bring about an international agreement on greenhouse gas emissions. The class is held in Paris, allowing participants to visit leading institutions that deal with energy and climate change emissions, such as the International Energy Agency, the OECD Nuclear Energy Agency, and the French agency responsible for urban planning. Also, we will interact with leading experts and advocates on global warming and energy.

Excursions

- Guided walking tour of Montmartre in the afternoon to explore the rich artistic history of Paris; to see Sacré Coeur, Vincent Van Gogh's House, Place du Tertre, Dali Museum,...
- Visit to the Institute d'Aménagement et d'Urbanisme (IAU) to learn more about their regional planning and development projects and policies
- Visit to PFC Energy which is an international advisor to energy companies and governments. The company works with corporate and regional executives to develop sustainable strategies.
- Guided tour of the famous museum Louvre, the former home of the kings of France
- Visit to French Environment and Energy Management Agency in Paris which focus on the emerging fields of knowledge and technology
- Guided tour of the famous Centre Pompidou
- Visit to Paris Region Economic Development Agency (PREDA) which enhance Paris' regions economic attractiveness and support areas affected by economic changes by focusing on attracting new investments and boost development potential
- Guided tour of the Musée d'Orsay, one of the famous museums in Paris
