NURS 4309: Global Perspectives on Nursing

Credit Hours: 3 semester units

Course Description: This study abroad program is designed for graduate nursing students interested in increasing their understanding of international health care issues as they relate to nursing practice and global health policy. The course intent is to broaden the student's worldview and global perspective of health care and nursing.
