Summer Term and Fall Semester 2010

The Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB) was founded in 1968 and is a young, dynamic institution, and is among the best academic centres in Spain, both for the quality of its teaching staff and for its excellent research.

UAB is spread across a large campus and has 43,000 students from around the world. Classes will take place at the Sant Pau and Sarrià Campuses. The Sarrià Campus is situated in the upper central area of Barcelona and located 12 minutes away from Plaza Catalunya by public transportation. This excellent connection offers students the benefit of being in central Barcelona and easy reach to all the services and facilities of one of the biggest campuses in Spain, the UAB Bellaterra Campus.

The UAB Bellaterra Campus provides all kind of additional services, including libraries, a language-learning center, sports facilities, restaurants, a health centre, bookshops and various other shops, making the campus a genuine community where studying takes place in an atmosphere of friendship and solidarity.

Housing and Meals

All students will be housed in shared student housing in the center of Barcelona, with easy access to the UAB campus by public transportation.

Meals, except for the welcome dinner, are not included in the program price. However, the university's restaurants offer reasonably priced meals.

Spanish Language Lessons:

An online placement test on the first day will determine which course level is required. Language lessons will focus on: grammar, conversation, writing, listening and reading comprehension and pronunciation.

Elective courses:

Elective courses will be taught in English. There are many subjects to choose from, including International Business, International Marketing Strategies, Spanish Civilization and Culture, Spanish Art and Cultural Heritage, Mediterranean Politics and Culture, E-Commerce, Online Business and many others. Credits

Upon successful completion and regular attendance of the program, students receive a certificate and ECTS credit points (see chart on the left) from the UAB that can be validated for credits at their home university. The amount of transferable credits is at the discretion of your university's regulations.

Cultural Excursions:

In addition to your course, a variety of cultural field trips, visits and hands-on experiences are included in the program, for example:

- Picasso Museum (entrance & public tour in English)
- Tour of Parc Guell with your coordinator
- Entrance to Sagrada Familia & Gaudi house
- Entrance to Fundacio Joan Miro
- Tapas & flamenco night
- Half or full day tour to Figueres & to Sitges
- Day excursion to Montserrat
- Weekend excursion to Madrid (fall term only)

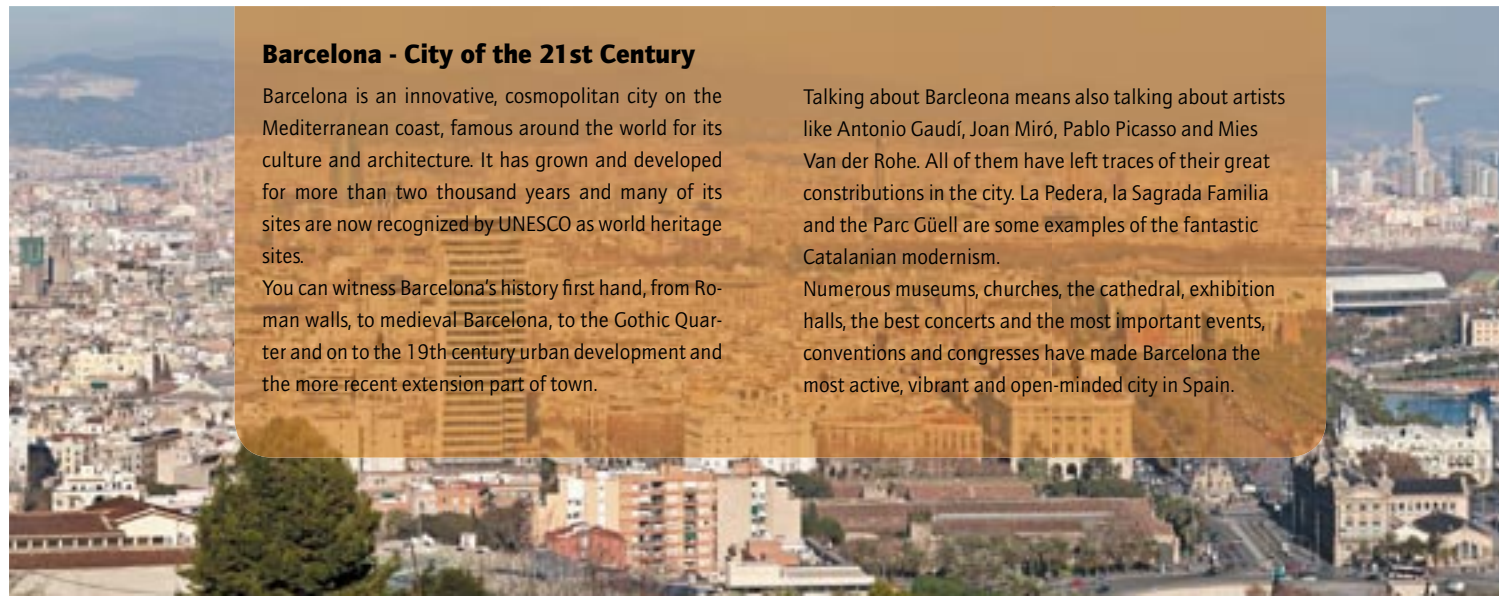
Barcelona - City of the 21st Century

Barcelona is an innovative, cosmopolitan city on the Mediterranean coast, famous around the world for its culture and architecture. It has grown and developed for more than two thousand years and many of its sites are now recognized by UNESCO as world heritage sites.

You can witness Barcelona's history first hand, from Roman walls, to medieval Barcelona, to the Gothic Quarter and on to the 19th century urban development and the more recent extension part of town.

Talking about Barcelona means also talking about artists like Antonio Gaudí, Joan Miró, Pablo Picasso and Mies Van der Rohe. All of them have left traces of their great contributions in the city. La Pedrera, la Sagrada Familia and the Parc Güell are some examples of the fantastic Catalan modernism.

Numerous museums, churches, the cathedral, exhibition halls, the best concerts and the most important events, conventions and congresses have made Barcelona the most active, vibrant and open-minded city in Spain.

Non-refundable deposit: **\$750** due 1 week after application

Final payment: due 3 weeks after applying and no later than **June 30th**

Not included in the price: International airfare, passport expenses, insurances, or any other personal expenses.

Payments can be made either via bank transfer or personal check.
